I don't care about the £4. colours suggested by the C.O. First, and as they are not "doubly-fugitive", I suggest they be exchanged for the 2nd alternative of Appendix 2.

As for the £15 value, the alternative suggested in App. 2. is quite close to the original suggestion, and I should be adopted.

There seems no necessity to adopt <sup>daya</sup> the alternatives suggested, for the £20 and £100 values; but I could wish that there had been an alternative <sup>to</sup> for the £5!

Colour proofs shown in App. 1., with the exception of those for the values £4 and £5, for which, in view of the colour mentioned in para 2 of their letter,

there should be substituted the 2<sup>nd</sup> suggestion, and the 4<sup>th</sup> suggestion (respectively) in App. 2. [Say the reasons for this change will be explained to O.A.G.; and return their proofs.

? inform O.A.G. ref. no. 804/25 that CA have submitted colour proofs in respect of the stamp values required, which have been approved with the exception of those for the values £4 & £5, the colours suggested for which could not be reproduced in the doubly-fugitive ink which it is usual to adopt as a measure of protection to the removal of cancellation, and that alternative colours have been approved in these two cases as follows:

Sir,

With reference to your letter No. 11906/1925 of the 20th. March and previous correspondence regarding the new denominations of Kenya and Uganda stamps, I have the honour to enclose for the consideration of the Secretary of State, colour proofs for the new duties in the colours selected by the Colonial Government. We also forward for comparison the original colour schemes for the current duties for this issue, from which it will be noted that the colours selected for the new duties differ in all cases from the colours of the existing stamps of the same size.

2. - We would, however, state that where possible, it is usual in the case of high value stamps, to introduce, as a measure of protection to the removal of cancellations, a colour which can be produced in a highly sensitive (doubly-fugitive) ink. These may be produced in three colours only, viz., purple, green and black. One of these - black - was used in the case of the existing £1, £5, £10, £25, and £50 stamps. The colours selected by the Colonial Government for the new duties from £2 and upwards can be applied in doubly-fugitive ink either for the border, or for the King's Head, except in the case of the £4 and £75 stamps. For these, we enclose alternative colours which can be produced in doubly-fugitive inks, together with further suggestions for the colours of the

£20 and £100 stamps. In the case of both these latter, the suggested alternative colours are entirely doubly-fugitive ink.

3. With regard to the point raised in paragraph 2 of your letter of the 19th February No. 6735/1925, neither the existing nor the suggested colours conform strictly to the Universal Colour Scheme, but this scheme was not prepared to cover such a large number of denominations being printed on white paper, as is the case in the present issue, comprising 19 duties of the large size design.
