Mr George Walters called this afternoon respecting his candidature for the above appointment, to advise us that he had undergone medical examination, and that the medical report was being forwarded to us by Mr Prout. He was told that, subject to his passing the medical examination, terms of agreement would be sent to him for signature, a specimen copy of which was shown him at the counter. In connection with insurance against accident and death, I told him he should endeavour to make his own arrangements immediately to cover himself in the above respect, and suggested an amount of £1,000. He told me he already held a life insurance policy with the Prudential Assurance Co. and he promised to call upon the Westminster Branch of the Company immediately on his return, and to fix this up, particulars of which he is advising us in a day or so, that is, as soon as he learns that he has passed the doctor and will be offered the appointment.

In accordance to your letter of the 30th March 1923, No. 11435/23, relating to the engagement of Mr George Walters, this man has signed his agreements and is sailing on the 16th instant.

A copy of the correspondence with Mr Walters relating to his insurance is attached. It will be seen from his letter of the 5th instant that he has reduced the amount of his policy to £700 and now asks that the premium should be paid by the Colonial Government.

In view of your decision that the Widows and Orphans Pension Scheme is not applicable in his case, will you please let us know whether we should insure him as in the case of the Mechanic appointed to supervise the erection of the linotype machinery in Sierra Leone and Gold Coast (vide your letter of the 11th September 1923 No. 44124/23).

We shall be glad to have your instructions as soon as possible.

Sir,

With reference to your telegram of the 7th May, 1925, I have to report that on the recommendation of Messrs. Fernald Palmer and Tritton, Mr. George Walters has been engaged as Foreman Erector for the erection of the Maragua Viaduct on the Mombasa Nyeri Extension. Two copies of the form of agreement which he has completed in respect of this engagement are enclosed together with particulars of his experience.

2. In view of the indefinite period of Mr. Walters' engagement the Secretary of State decided that the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Scheme is not applicable in his case but has agreed that no should be imposed against Employers' liability under the Workmen's Compensation Act and against personal accident and death in sum of £500 each. This has been done for one year from the 15th May and should his services be retained beyond this period we shall be glad to receive due notice so far as may be required that the period of insurance may be extended.

3. On the recommendations of the Consulting Engineers Mr. Walters has been overlooking the work at the yard of the Patent Shaft and Axletree Company since the 23rd February, during which period in accordance with the terms of his agreement he has been paid salary at the rate of £6. per week. As advised in our telegram of the 11th May a passage has been provided for Mr. Walters in the s.s. "Merkara" due to leave England on the 15th instant.
