I am directed by the Secretary of State to inform you that subject to his being satisfied with the reports which may be received at your bank in respect of your business, and with the result of your latest examination and audit of the year 1955, he is prepared to grant you an advance to assist you for the purpose of... 2. Enclosed herewith are the general conditions attached to the advance in Kenya and the repayment arrangements in three or twelve months, but you are to understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced by, or with the sanction of, the Secretary of State. Your attention is invited to the paragraph in the Government African Loans Act of 1954, and to the provisions of Government orders. A copy of the Regulations as to conditions and a copy of the Colonial Regulations are also enclosed.

3. The advance is to be repaid to the Secretary of State available for expenditure on any expenditure which the Secretary of State may direct, and it will be within his discretion to forward to the Secretary of State your transfer to public bank of the administration of the advance to be repaid.

4. You will be required during your first term to pass a suitable medical examination in your appointment in order to secure a course of instruction in the following subjects: Tropical Hygiene and Sanitation; Criminal Law; Evidence and Procedure; Colonial System of Accounts; Tropical Diseases and Epidemics; Elements of International Law; Commercial Law; Elementary Surveying and Mining.

Particulars of the course will be sent to you at the close of the year.

If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these conditions you should present yourself to one of the medical officers of this Department, whose names are given in the enclosed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with him and you will be required to pay him a fee of one and a half guineas. You should complete the enclosed form and send it to the Medical Officer at the close of the examination. He will send his report to the Department.

5. I am to inform you that you will state whether you accept this offer. *Answer: I understand that, as that can be if it is as far as I have to do, I will be prepared to accept the offer of the Medical Officer, the 15th Oct, and accommodation has been provisionally booked. You furnish me with an address to which communications intended for your relatives or friends may be sent during your absence from this country.*

6. A copy of notes for Officers appointed to Kenya and Uganda is enclosed.
