Attorney-General - v. J. Orlson.

We thank you for your letter of the 29th instant, reference 41071/25 enclosing a copy of the correspondence with the Law Officers Department regarding the case of the above.

2. The Attorney-General sometime ago issued his fiat for proceedings to recover £60 due to the Government of Nigeria. Proceedings were accordingly commenced but it has so far not been ^{possible} able to serve the Defendant.

3. Exhaustive enquiries have been made by ourselves and by process servers whom we instructed and it is believed that a warrant has been issued for the Defendant's arrest, but this has not been confirmed.

4. The Attorney-General has now issued his fiat for the proceedings to recover the £20 which was the subject of correspondence with you, but in view of our inability to serve the Defendant we do not propose to put the Colony to the additional expense of taking these further proceedings until we have further information as to the whereabouts of the Defendant.
