I am directed by the Disposal & Liquidation Commission to refer to Colonial Office communication with enclosures - No. 55798/1923 - of the 8th December last regarding the amounts due from Messrs. Hogg and Moynagh in respect of the sale of Salvage Stores, and to state that the action taken by the Governor of Kenya in connection therewith is concurred in by this Commission.

It is understood that the accounts for the year 1922/23 recently received in the War Office from the Officer in Charge of the War Accounts Clearance Section contain no reference to the sums referred to in Despatch No. 718 from the Governor of Kenya as having been handed over to the Clearance Section, and I am to enquire if information can be obtained regarding the method by which these payments were credited to Imperial Funds.
