## ESTIMATES - 1926.

The following new posts and alterations in existing grades have been inserted in the Estimates for 1926, with the approval of the Inter-Colonial Railway Council. I should be glad if these could be submitted to the Secretary of State for his approval, in order that there may be no delay in making the necessary appointments.

MAINTENANCE ENGINEER. Increments in the scale of salary attached to this post have been altered from £25 to £50, to bring them into line with other appointments carrying equivalent salaries.

LAND SURVEYOR. A new post is proposed on the scale £500-£700 in view of the probability of this Administration taking over control of Railway land in the near future. - *appointments not to be made until required*

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENTS. Two additional posts have been provided for, replacing the posts of Local Superintendents, Jinja and Kampala, which it is proposed to abolish.

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENTS (LOCOMOTIVE). One additional Assistant Superintendent has been included. This appointment

is necessary in view of the extension of the system, and of increased traffic.

MECHANICAL ENGINEER. The title of this office has been altered to Mechanical Engineer and Workshop Manager, which it is considered more accurately describes the duties of the post. ✓

SENIOR FOREMAN (WORKSHOPS). This is a new post on the scale £400-20-500 and £500-25-600, which it is desired to create in order to provide for additional superintendence in the workshops. ✓

ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT (COMMERCIAL). It is proposed to grant a special increment of £50 from 1.4.1926 in addition to normal increment due on that date, to the present holder (Mr. L.M. Smart) to bring his salary into line with that of other Assistant Superintendents who have equal service in this grade, and who are performing equivalent duties. Mr. Smart has done excellent work and is not well paid for his responsibilities. ✓

CHIEF STOREKEEPER. The scale of this post has been altered from £900 to £900-50-1,000, which is considered to be more commensurate with the responsibilities of the office, and to place it in its proper relation to other senior appointments. The work in the Stores Department has increased enormously and the officer in charge has handled the position effectively.
