Mr. Stack to take up the post of Deputy Commissioner at a salary of £ 700 p.a. ~~It is~~ ~~proposed~~ that there will be no difficulty over the issue of his pension in full. As nothing has been said to him so far, it might be desirable to sound him semi-officially in the first instance.

When we have his acceptance we can close the matter by telegraphing to Sir E. Baring, the Colonial Secretary, to be satisfied that Mr. Stack is a suitable person for the post. It is proposed to offer Mr. Stack the post of Deputy Commissioner on Monday night.

Mr. Stack's appointment would be completed by Mr. Franklin and he would at the same time be asked to offer Mr. C. B. (who is already at work) the appointment of the large office, namely, £ 700 p.a. - £ 350.

During the evening, Colonel Franklin is having difficulty in the running of the office, but he hopes to get away before he leaves London on the 5th of the month. The Colonial Secretary will arrive in London only just after the evening.

It is proposed to have a formal opening ceremony at which the Secretary of State will be present and therefore the dates are limited through the Secretary of State's absence and the Christmas holidays. The 4th of January is the only suitable date to choose.

The intention is to arrange with the Royal Colonial Institute for them to have a Luncheon on this occasion at which, in addition to the Secretary of State and members of the Advisory Board various parties interested in East Africa and other parts of the Government will attend.
