In creating the Commission to receive your proposals for an
increase of wages for immediate consideration of labor
branches has of course been my duty to consider all aspects
of the matter and to report to you accordingly. I have
therefore considered the proposals and the Commission

I am therefore glad to see that the discussion at the
Conference regarding the limitation of the basic
wages has been carried out in a satisfactory manner.
The proposals of approach (a) made on this point
by the Government of Kenya and Nyaland in addition to
