Gentlemen,

Usin-Gishu Railway.

We beg to acknowledge receipt of the Quarterly Progress Report for the period ending 30th September, 1924, together with six sheets showing graphically the progress made in the construction of the Usin-Gishu Railway.

2. We observe that no platelaying has been done during the quarter, the head being still at Mile 15 1/2. The Nobko Viaduct has been half completed. Staff quarters are shown as completed, and several other buildings, including mile and construction posts, telegraph instruments, engineering plant, and sections and bridge furniture are also shown as only half completed.

The estimated time for completion of the line is given as 31st March 1925.
