Sir,

The proposals for administering the Northern Frontier District outlined in my letter of the 10th inst. render the post of Officer in Charge at present held by P. H. B. Kittermaster unnecessary, but introduce the necessity for certain boundary commissions in that area.

2. Mr. Kittermaster knows the Northern Frontier District intimately, and has also served in Turkey. I feel, therefore, that useful work might be performed by him in the near future as a member of such commissions. To enable him to do this I would suggest that he should take a course in theodolite work while he is on leave in England. He already has a knowledge of plane table survey.

Mr. Kittermaster is interested in survey work and I have the honour to recommend that every facility be given him to enable him to acquire the necessary knowledge of theodolite survey work.
