I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No 16046/1920 of the 9th inst. transmitting the Acting Governor's despatch of February 20th on the subject of the establishment of the Medical Department in the East Africa Protectorate.

2. I agree that there is no objection to the separation of the Sanitation and Medical branches.
3. I consider that the post of Resident Surgical Officer Nairobi should be in substitution for a junior appointment, and I agree that it is unnecessary to create a similar post at Mombasa to accommodate Dr Henderson.
