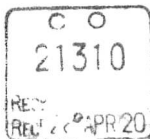
I have asked Sir E. Worthy to

were surveyed and 189,000 acres  
remained to be surveyed, in the  
Kunga district, while the <sup>area of</sup> 100,000  
acres in the Taveta <sup>District</sup> ~~area~~ was then  
being surveyed.
