His Excellency is well aware that in most cases such an exhortation is unmecessary, but it has not secaped his notice that certain exceptions exist and he relies upon you to take care that no official in your Department, whose duties are slackly and inefficiently performed, is either recommended for an increment or, if his unsatisfactory conduct continues, allowed to remain in Government employment.

It should similarly understood that promotion in the service does not depend on seniority only but on ability and seal.
