Mr. Nair called today and asked for
an extension of leave for 3 months. He does not seem
to worry about pay & I said it would probably
if grants be without pay. He reasons on that
he has now got the L.M. exams to take a Public
Health examination in October. He pointed out that
it is probably the only chance he will ever have
of pursuing these studies & taking the examination.
He is booked (2nd class) for 25 August.
I told him that he shall apply in writing
for the extension stating the reasons & that we should
probably have to refer to the Govt by telegraph.
He said he had no doubt that the P.M.D. would
recommend the extension.

After he had gone I warned ~~that~~ that ~~they~~
he might not be able to start on 25 Aug. They
said that they must either cancel the passage
today or keep the ticket & pay for it. I said I
would let them know by 5 o'clock today whether
to cancel it or not.

Mr. Nair has found the money for his
passage. An amount of £35 was given him for
this purpose. He expressed his desire to refund the
amount if required.




Sir,

I have the honour to apply for 3 months extension
my leave which expires on the 1st August 1920.

My case in short, is as follows:

I was able to get an accumulated leave of 11 months
which the Protectorate Government was pleased to let me
spend in England with a view to undertaking medical
study. I might however, mention here that the Govt.,
according to the regulations governing the Asiatic
affairs in the Protectorate, was absolutely powerless

to give me any help of a financial nature or otherwise
+ even a passage to Europe and only half salary and
per-bonus while on leave here - in spite of the fact
at what ever knowledge I might be gaining in my
profession in this Country would be of use to the
Protectoral Government.

I have already taken out a Course in Tropical Medicine and passed an examination at the London School of Tropical Medicine and have spent 6 months in various medical institutions in Ireland receiving a Diploma in Midwifery and other certificate.

I now intend to appear for the examination for Diploma in San. Science which is to be held in Dublin in October 1920 and it is for the purpose that I apply for the extension.

I beg to point out that the above Sanitary qualification will be a very useful addition to my present position in the Health Department of the Protectorate and this is a chance I should not like to miss if I could possibly keep it. In these circumstances I hope you will be kind enough to consider my application favourably and inform the Crown Agents accordingly as they are now making arrangements for my return journey to Br. East Africa.
