To me, offering me an appointment as Second Class Inspector in The Postal and Telegraph Department of the Kenya Colony and Protectorate.

After carefull consideration of the offer as now detailed I am unable to accept.

I had understood from the previous specification that, should circumstances arise which would prevent me continuing my Colonial duties after having completed two years service in the Colony I could return to my present duties in Britain, but it has now been pointed out to me that my present rank of U.S.W. eliminates this privilage.

Sir,

I am directed by Viscount Milner to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for probationary appointment as a Second Class Telegraph Inspector in the Postal and Telegraph Department of the Kenya Colony and Protectorate with salary at the rate of £300 per annum, rising by annual increments of £15 to £350 per annum. Although the rupee is now fixed at 2/- in East Africa, starting salaries are for the present converted at Rupees 15 to the £, and you would be paid at that rate in East Africa when drawing salary in respect of resident service in East Africa, so long as this concession is granted, <sup>generally</sup> to officials in East Africa. If finally selected for the appointment, you will be paid an allowance of £30 towards the purchase of outfit.

2. Furnished quarters when available will be provided by the Government free of rent, but not of rates or similar outgoings. When such quarters are not available, a hut or other temporary shelter is provided, or an allowance in lieu of quarters at the discretion of the Government. Free 2nd class passages will be provided to and from East Africa, and a free pass over the Uganda Railway between Mombasa and the place at which you are stationed.

3. Memoranda showing the general conditions attached to appointments in the Protectorate and the leave and passage regulations for civil officers are enclosed herewith, but you are to understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State. A copy of the regulations as to pensions and a copy of the Colonial Regulations are also enclosed.

4. If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these conditions, you should present yourself to one of the medical advisers of this Department, whose names are given on the enclosed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with him, and he will send his report direct to this Department. The fee of one guinea for the examination

will be paid by the Government, and if you have to make a railway journey for the purpose of visiting the Medical Adviser, you may submit a claim to this Department for the refund of your return journey (3rd class.)

5. I am to request that you will inform me as soon as possible whether you wish to accept this offer and you should also inform me of the earliest date on which you will be able to leave for East Africa.

6. You should at the same time furnish me with an address to which communications intended for your relatives or friends may be sent during your absence from this country.

7. A copy of "Notes for Officers appointed to East Africa and Uganda" is enclosed.
