I have to thank you for your letter of the 14th. The decision of the Governor of Kenya Colony does not surprise me: since I met Mr. Hattiscomb I have recognised that Kenya Colony does not require a road within easy reach of any existing Railway and that my proposals were therefore not applicable to that territory, so far as the Powell Road Process was concerned.

(2) You will, I think, understand that, after waiting so long for a definite decision, I am naturally anxious to bring some part of my original proposals to fruition. I therefore beg that I may be permitted to meet Messrs Amery, Sir Herbert Read and Mr. Robinson, in order that I may amend those proposals to meet the present situation.

I have to be in London from the 10th to the 12th and I think that ten minutes would be sufficient for such a purpose. I trust that the Conference for which you have arranged. In that case, if you are good enough to write to me c/o Messrs. Rhys Roberts, 11, Queen Victoria Street, E.C.4, (Telephone No. 234) I shall gladly attend at any time that you may suggest.
