My Lord,

I have the honour to refer to my despatch No. 132 of February 6th 1920, transmitting indents for certain stores the need for which is recurrent, and to ask Your Lordship whether Colonial Office Regulation 380 is intended to apply to such.

2. Indents for stores to replace ordinary waste and wear must necessarily be sent in anticipation of the approval of the Estimates in which provision is made for their payment. To send them for Your Lordship's sanction appears to be an unnecessary procedure not intended by the Colonial Office Regulation in question and involving merely a waste of time on the part of Your Lordship and the Governor of the Protectorate.

3. I understand that the Uganda Railway forward such indents direct to the Crown Agents and to ask Your Lordship's ruling that all similar indents be treated in this way. I would point out that I am only suggesting this course in the matter of indents for replacements chargeable against recurrent votes.
