Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the inquiry contained in the third paragraph of Colonel Amery's despatch No. 425 of the 17th March relating to the abolition of Rabai as a sub-station in the Nyika Reserve and to inform you that it has not been passed as yet to complete the road to Kilifi. Progress is being made as rapidly as circumstances permit but full will not permit of the construction of proper bridges and it will be necessary to make use of native temporary bridges for the time being.

2. I have to point out, however, that even on the completion of the road it will be difficult to abandon Rabai until provision can be made for the erection of quarters for the Assistant District Commissioner and for the Kilifi. A sum of £4200 was allocated for allocation from the proposed loan but will not be forthcoming for the present, and arrangements are being made to rent a private house at Kilifi from the Lualaba of Mombasa for the accommodation of the second Administrative Officer in the Nyika Reserve.
