I have asked the Exhibition architect and engineer to go carefully into the cost of special temporary buildings with a view to reducing, if possible, the estimate already given, which I consider high; but the former (Mr. Aryston) is in Sweden, and we cannot expect revised figures for a few weeks. Meanwhile the preparation of our circular for the Colonies is held up, and I suggest using the present figures for a cable to Kenya in the meantime

Referring to your despatch, the cost of special temporary building about 20,000 sq. ft. present estimate 12/- per sq. ft. plus 3/6d for roads, drainage, lighting etc. equivalent to 23/3d per ft. net space allowing one-third for gangways etc. but these figures are now under consideration with a view to reduction stop Charge for space in main Exhibition building expected to be 20/- per sq. ft. stop Cost of stands which is additional in either case depends on size, design and market prices then ruling. Details as to proposed arrangements will be sent by despatch as soon as possible."

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No.1382 of 13th September and your Circular despatch of 16th September relating to the British Empire Exhibition to be held in 1923 and to thank you for the information therein conveyed.

2. The various issues connected with the arrangement of an exhibit from this Colony are being investigated and the neighbouring Empires are being addressed with a view to concerted action.

3. Before any definite conclusion can be reached as to the establishment of an "East Africa House" it is necessary to obtain some idea of the cost of erecting and decorating a suitable building. I would request therefore that the Executive Council of the Exhibition may be invited to furnish an estimate of the probable cost of a building to include floor space amounting to 10,000 square feet with further allowance for the necessary gangways, etc., for the public.

4. I should further be grateful for information as to the probable cost of a stand for an exhibit
