Sir,

I have the honour to report that a small disturbance amongst the Masai on the borders of Tanganyika Territory occurred last month, the facts being briefly as follows:-

On the 20th of November about 300 Purko Masai Moran proceeded on a raid across the border into Tanganyika Territory for the purpose of looting cattle. An engagement between these Masai and the Waregi took place in the Uregi country situated North of the Mara River in the Mwanza District in which the Masai suffered heavy casualties, estimated at 50 killed, 70 missing presumably killed: the survivors are believed to number less than eighty while the Waregi casualties are reported as very slight.

2. Steps are being taken to punish the offenders; there is no reason to apprehend any further recurrence of the disturbance.
