I have the honour to enclose a copy of a letter which we have received from the Treasurer, Kenya, regarding the sale of securities which we hold on behalf of the Custodian of Enemy Property for East Africa.

2. I would point out that owing to the depreciation which has taken place in the value of the securities that have been purchased, more stock will have to be sold to realise the required amounts than was originally purchased with these sums. It will be seen that if we proceed in this manner, there will be insufficient stock left in the account to meet the amounts which may have to be realised at a later date on account of other investments held on behalf of the Custodian of Enemy Property.

I would also point out that when we have been instructed to invest money on account of the Custodian of Enemy Property, we have not been informed of the person on whose behalf the money was to be invested. Consequently we are unable to state the exact amount of stock purchased on behalf of Messrs C & F Schwendler, as the amount was probably included in a larger remittance. The case is similar to that of Mr. Kov of Ceylon which is referred to in our letter of the 22nd January 1920, No. A/808, and in Colonial Office letter No. 18327 of 15th May, 1920.
