THE PETROLEUM (SECURITY) ORDINANCE, 1921.  
STATEMENT OF WORKING OF SECTION.

This Ordinance was passed to get rid of <sup>the</sup> obsolete restriction placed on the keeping of dangerous petroleum by Section 8 of the Indian Petroleum Act, 1899, which prohibits the possession without a licence of any amount exceeding three gallons. This Section has been replaced by one allowing the possession and transport of dangerous petroleum without a licence when it is kept in securely stopped vessels.
