My Lord Duke,

With reference to Mr. Winston Churchill's despatch No. 1221 of the 21st August, 1922, regarding the issue of a Special Warrant for Florins 652,210-77 cents in connection with military expenditure during the financial year 1920-21, I have the honour to inform Your Grace that the original estimate of £43,277 for the last three months of that year was based upon an average of the expenditure for the previous nine months April 1st to December 31st, 1920, but proved fallacious owing to various adjustments for rates not to be made during the period in question. The actual military expenditure for the full year, however, did not exceed the original sanction and the approved estimates the relative amounts being £209,342 and £210,011 respectively.

I regret to report that upon investigation it has been ascertained that this Colony is not entitled to a refund from the Military Accounts Department as anticipated in paragraph 2 of my predecessor's despatch No. 940 of 14th May, 1922.
