Dear Mr. Kinson,

I wrote to Knox on the 21st asking for an explanation of the circumstances in which it is not considered necessary in East African cases to average house allowance where salary is averaged.

In cases in which the practice is to take the house allowance at 1/10th of the salary, and when the salary is averaged to take 1/10th of that average of 15%.

In the case of Independent... was introduced... allowance was... pension at 10%... minimum...

Strictly speaking, all allowances ought to be averaged when the salary itself is averaged in view of Section 26 of the Regulations. It appears however to be undesirable to attach average house allowance in the case of Europeans who retire within two years of the change of grade.

we decided that it was unnecessary to adhere closely to the  
terms of the Imperial Superannuation Acts and we awarded an  
... of the new minimum in all cases.

We do not propose to continue this practice in  
future. For instance if a European retires after 1st April  
next and his salary is averaged owing to a change of class,  
the average of the house allowance will be taken, based on  
15% of the old minimum for that part of the two years which  
preceded the change of class and on 15% of the new minimum  
for the rest of the two years period.

I trust that this is clear and that the practice  
is equitable.
