The persons to whom, under the new Ordinance, licences may be granted, will not be placed upon the medical register of the Colony, but will merely be authorised to practise during such time as the Medical Officer is satisfied that the public interest that they should do so. Under these conditions, Mr. CHURCH does not consider that the system is likely to give rise to abuse and he trusts that your consideration and in the light of his remarks, you will find this...

I wish to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th July, regarding the proposed of the Kenya Medical Association and Dentists Ordinance, 1922, and to inform you that the said Ordinance has now been passed. A copy of the Ordinance, which is entitled "The Medical Practitioners and Dentists (Kenya) Ordinance, 1922", is enclosed herewith for the information of the Association.

2. I am to observe that in the present financial circumstances of the Govt. have no option but to reduce the number of Assistant and Sub-Assistant Surgeons in certain parts of the Colony, and that when such officials have rendered meritorious services, it would appear to be inequitable and, indeed, contrary to the interests of the Colony, in view of the small number of European doctors, that they should be debarred from continuing to practise. The licensing of Assistant and Sub-Assistant Surgeons affords the benefit of the services of persons
