I have the honour to transmit a Form of Particulars required for the computation of gratuity payable to Sheikh Ashora bin Amber (Native), Akiba of Ezo, who has been retrenched from the Service on account of the abolition of the post.

INSTRUCTIONS REFERRED TO ON PAGE 1.

**In this Paper of Postponement and the Certificate mentioned
to not need to be signed, the copies must be duly attested.**

Case 1.—In the case of an Officer residing in the West Coast of Africa, a statement is to be submitted to the Civil Service Office. (Colonial Regulations, § 400.)

Case 2.—State the description of employment for which the applicant is recommended, viz. Postmaster, Commissioner, Superintendent, or otherwise, and the amount. In the case of the latter an addition to that of the amount of support of Postmaster or other special qualifications, should be stated, and a reference should be given to the authority under which the claim is made.

Case 3.—If the service has been interrupted by one or more breaks, the word "broken" should be used before or after the several years and months, and all names, dates, and circumstances of such or broken service to be stated under heading 5.

Case 4.—If the Pension having been taken in respect of the same Salary, or in the case from which he was for the 20 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the actual period of service in respect of that time should be inserted, provided the word "actual" is added, and the average annual amount of Salary of that time to be inserted, and provided the total amount should be inserted, provided by the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

Case 5.—A separate statement should be inserted of the average Salary Table for the 20 months immediately preceding retirement, if such Table is not in force at the date of retirement, which is stated in the certificate of the Pension or Gratuity.

Whenever the value of a Pension of *Gratia* is stated, an approximate amount, together with the salary and other emoluments which would be payable thereon, is to be indicated in each of the columns, so that it shall not exceed one-fourth of the whole.

From which an entry is allowed to retire for his own use will be taken the amount of Pension payable, with regular salary, at the annual average of the rate payable of the 20 months immediately before the date of retirement. There are no exceptions to be made from the general amount of Pension such Officer receives, as an officer may have had to leave his own resources, in performing the services for which he was recommended by the Government, but from the Pension should be made in respect of Office Expenses payable to Public Funds for the discharge of those duties to which a Pension is awarded. In the case of "Postmaster" what is referred to the Colonial Department should be accompanied by the certificate from the retiring Officer, showing the amount required by him for both, and which is to be deducted from the Office Expenses, &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement. It will be the duty of the Colonial Government to make a statement of the average of such amounts before forwarding them to the Colonial Office, in the case of Officers receiving Pension before and from, the Pension will not be considered as allowed to retire for Pension purposes in the event of more than one year of the Salary and Pension will not in any case be allowed to count for Pension purposes during a period in which the whole time of the Officer claiming them was not given to the Public Service.

Case 6.—In case of infirmity, if the applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Certificate is to be furnished stating that he is disqualified by infirmity of mind or body for discharge of duties of his office, and that such infirmity is likely to be permanent.

In case of any special service or merit, this certificate should be signed by two Officers, who, at least one should, if possible, be a Superior Officer of the Government.

Case 7.—As to "broken" service see Case 3.

If the applicant has had any "acting" service, the details must be fully stated, and whether or not, during the "acting" service, he was entitled to any Civil Service of the Colony.

Case 8.—If in special circumstances, a professional Civil Officer has been allowed to leave "acting" without fulfilling his duties in Pension, the facts are to be fully stated.

Case 9.—If the applicant is liable to any deduction from his annual salary under the Civil Regulations, the facts are to be fully stated.

Case 10.—The length of service and other particulars of the commission are to be given. When an Officer of Salary, &c., is taken, the mode of discharging it is to be stated, and the date of retirement.
