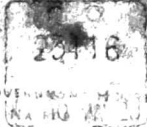

My Lord,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Colonel Amery's despatch No.88 of the 20th January and to inform Your Lordship that Mrs. Price's claim for war gratuity has been referred again to the Staff Captain, East Africa Expeditionary Force, who reports that after careful consideration with the Principal Medical Officer he is unable to vary the decision conveyed to Your Lordship in my telegram No.938 of the 24th December last. The Principal Medical Officer endorses this opinion and has forwarded in support of his view the accompanying copy of the letter notifying Mrs. Lawrence-Dale's now Mrs. Price's resignation.

East Africa Medical Service up to the beginning of 1918 and, so far as is known, is still alive.

3. I regret to state that the instructions contained in Your Lordship's despatch of 27th June were misinterpreted locally and that a nominal roll of all nurses of the East Africa Nursing Service was submitted, under cover of Mr. Monson's despatch No. 799 of the 15th August. It was not known definitely at the time which of the nurses had proceeded to England and in the absence of a copy of the Army Order on the subject dated the 9th May, 1919, and the regulations laid down in Your Lordship's despatch No. 848 of the 26th August, it was considered

that all the nurses were entitled to a gratuity. Subsequent experience has proved that all these applications require the scrutiny of the local General Head-Quarters and I shall be glad if any similar claims for gratuity may be forwarded to me for reference to the Staff Captain, East Africa Expeditionary Force, before any disbursements are sanctioned.

4. I venture to leave to Your Lordship's decision the question of the recovery of the £20 advanced to Mrs. Price on the strength of her supposed eligibility for the concession.
