I have the honour to forward, in advance of the general estimates for the year 1920-21, the estimates of the Education Department.

2. The estimates originally submitted by the Director of Education have been drastically curtailed, and I feel that no further reduction should be made on the figures which are now presented to you. Education facilities for all sections of the Community are grievously inadequate, and it is highly desirable that the small increases now asked for, which provide for necessary support to the existing establishments and not for the opening up of new ones, should be sanctioned without delay, in order to avoid the threatened necessity for having to refuse children admission to the schools.

3. The additional staff for which provision is now made is as follows:-

- Item 12. 1 Asst. Master Nairobi "A" School
- 15. 1 Asst. Mistress do.
- 24. 1 Asst. Master Nakuru "A" School
- 47. 1 Asst. Teacher (Asiatic) Nairobi "B" School.
- 63. Headmaster Ukamba Native School.

The last item is virtually a new appointment and the post of Technical Instructor (item 64) is not, although it appears to be so in the schedule. It is proposed that the present headmaster should fill the latter post, the new Headmaster being required to organize and develop Native Schools in the District. 537

4. The scales of salary of the existing establishment have in several cases been raised, in order to enable competent persons to be engaged. The higher scales are already in force, having been contemplated and provided for in the estimates for 1919-20 under item 70, "Additional Allowments".

5. At the end of the schedule provision is made for the new school at Malindi for education of Arab, Swahili, and Indian Children. This school has been endowed by Sheikh Ali bin Salim, who has provided a building, the funds accruing from the endowment appearing in the estimates as an amount corresponding to the expenditure under Revenue Head IV, Fees of Court.

6. The necessity for obtaining sanction to incur the expenditure detailed in these estimates is an urgent one, and I trust that Your Lordship will convey your approval thereto by telegraphic reply, having regard to the exceptional circumstances in which the estimates for the year 1920-21 are delayed. The need for securing

staff

staff to fill existing vacancies as well as the new posts is also a pressing one, and I therefore attach a statement of establishment and vacancies and would ask that immediate steps may be taken to fill them. It should be noted however that previous requests have already been made for filling the vacancies in the 1919-20 establishment in my telegram No. 90 of 29th January and Sir


Edward Northey's telegram No. 245 of 19th March of 1919, and the statement attached should therefore be examined to ensure that no recently made appointments, of which I am unaware, have been omitted. The posts which are underlined are the new ones which are provided for for the first time in the 1920-21 estimates, and require sanction. It is desirable that a candidate selected for an appointment should be informed that he is liable to be posted at any school.

As regards the rates of salary, which I believe not sufficient to attract many applicants, I would suggest that if the new scales have been decided upon and any allowance is to be made for conversion at Rs.10 to £1, the actual sterling value of the salary should be offered. In explanation I would suggest that a salary of £300 per annum paid at Rs.15 does not appear so attractive to a person unaccustomed to deal with a Rupee Currency as a salary of £450 per annum paid at Rs.10 to £1. But if this rate is quoted in regard to new appointments it is undesirable that there should be any differentiation

differentiation with existing appointments, and  
All sterling salaries should be quoted at Rs.10  
to £1 throughout.
