The appointment of Italian, American and Portuguese Consular representatives at Nairobi which will in all probability be followed by similar action on the part of other powers, renders it desirable that the legal status of such persons should be clearly ascertained and defined. I have, therefore, the honour to request that the matter may be considered and general instructions issued.

2. I understand that the privileges and immunities enjoyed by members of the Diplomatic Services of the various nations are extensive, but I believe that Consular Officers "ad nomine" cannot claim to be entitled to them. There is however a certain tendency to make such claims and I should be glad to know how far they are admissible.

3. A specific case is the compellability of

of a foreign Consul to give evidence in the
Protectorate Courts. My legal advisers hold
that he is so compellable, but that he cannot
be arrested if he refuses to attend.

4. I should be very grateful if Your
Lordship would cause me to be furnished with a
full exposition of the principles and practice
governing the treatment of the Consular
representatives of foreign powers. This
information would also doubtless be useful for
the administrations of neighbouring Protectorates.
