reference to your No. 8595/103 of 13th inst., Treating copy of Colonial Office Dispatch No. 325 of 10th March, I have the honour to inform you that, owing to fluctuations in costs of material and the local currency now being fixed at Rs.10 to the pound instead of Rs.15 when the estimates were prepared, the original estimation cannot be adhered to.

The rolling stock will evidently cost less than anticipated, whereas staff quarters, new stations and the sheds enlargements will cost considerably more.

As far as I can foretell at present, not having received all the charges for the rolling stock, the excess will about balance the savings.

In accordance with clause 4 of Ordinance 11 of His Excellency the Governor may, with the approval of the Secretary of State, vary the amounts so allocated; I, therefore, request sanction to the savings on rolling stock being used to meet the expenses in the other items - a detail of these allocations to be forwarded when the cost of the rolling stock is ascertained.

It is, of course, understood that the sum of £600 sanctioned by the Secretary of State will in no case be exceeded.
