STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of the Bill is to bring the law of the Protectorate into line with that of the United Kingdom regarding the restrictions placed on enemy subjects in the business of banking for five years after the war.

The Bill when it has passed the Legislative Council can in my opinion properly be enacted by the Governor.



War Bonus, Gratuity etc. for Native Tailors & Saddlers

Reference your memo No. S. 1000/00 of 21/5/20

The Commandant is of the following opinion:

1. That in British Regiments the work performed by the non-combatants in the King's African Rifles is, generally speaking, performed by soldiers taken from the ranks of the Regiments, i.e. Regimental Carpenters, Tailors, Clerks, Saddlers, Shoemakers, etc. All these would be entitled to gratuity as the rank and file of the King's African Rifles are not sufficiently educated to perform these duties. It is necessary to get outside help as they leave in Barracks and accompany the battalions on service, they are, to all intents and purposes, soldiers.

2. That Sir H.J. Reid's suggestion for granting the same appointments for the purpose of gratuity is a very fair one, and seems to solve the difficulty as regards analogous ranks in the Army.

3. It will be observed that although these non-combatants are not actually attested they come under the King's African Rifles Ordinance No. 15 of 1917 for discipline etc. and Section B Para (c) and Section 40 (1) (b).

MEDICAL BOARD REPORT ON A DISABLED OFFICER

(Also to be used for Disabled Nurses)

STATEMENT OF CASE

Note: In answering the following questions the Board is authorized to examine the officer's service records recorded in his medical documents. The officer's statements should be checked.

6. Disability (1) Ventral Hernia (2) Strabismic Amblyopia

7. Date of origin of disability (1) August 1916 (2) 1916

8. Place of origin of disability Wairoa, B.H.A.

9. Give concisely the essential facts bearing on the history of the disability (personal and family history, etc.)

Note: Board subsequent to the first should refer here the progress of the case since the officer's last report.

Some seven years ago (April, 1909) he was operated on in Wairoa for appendicitis. Some two years after he had developed a slight ventral hernia at the site of the scar. This ventral hernia is stated to have rapidly become larger by the exertion of working a motor saw. The strabismic amblyopia occurring at the same time in August 1916. Operations for the cure of these conditions was undertaken in November 1916 and since then both hernias have recurred.

OPINION OF THE MEDICAL BOARD

Note: (1) The Board will on no account inform the officer of its opinion on any of the following questions

(a) Other and decisive matters should be filled in by the Board to enable the Medical Director to make a decision on the officer's claim to pension or

(b) Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," should be avoided.

(c) When there is more than one disability the reasons should be given for each.

10. Was the disability contracted (a) before entering the service? (b) in the service?

11. Was it attributable to military service? If so, in what specific military conditions was it incurred? With the mechanical transport in B.H.A.

12. If not attributable to, was it aggravated by military service? (a) aggravated by service with the mechanical transport in B.H.A.

14. What is the officer's present condition? There is a very large hernia involving the greater part of the right lower abdominal area. The abdominal wall over this is considerably thinner and apparently the muscular tissue absent.

The inguinal ring on the right side is patent and the hernia comes down to the level of the umbilicus owing to the condition of the abdominal wall. This case is unsuitable for operative treatment.

15. To what degree is the officer disabled at the present time? (Twenty) (Degree of disablement should be expressed in the following percentages: 10, 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 70, 80, 90, 100, or 110.)

16. Is the disability permanent? (2) Yes.

17. If not permanent, how soon is re-examination recommended? F.A. 12 months.

18. Is it necessary that the officer should be re-examined by the same Board? No.

19. What treatment is the officer receiving, and where, and from whom? None.

20. Is the officer in need of special medical treatment of any kind, and if so, of what nature? Required to wear an abdominal belt to support the hernia.

21. Does the officer require the constant attendance of another person? No.

22. Officers will be classified by the Medical Board under one of the following categories, the probable period of unfitness for the higher categories being stated. Examination of these categories is in para. 5 of A.O.C. 1677/1917. In case of nurses, omit B. and (i) and (ii) of E.

- A.—Fit for general service.
- B.—Fit for service in a garrison or labour unit abroad.
- C.—Fit for home service:—
 - (i) Active duty with troops.
 - (ii) Sedentary employment only.
- D.—Fit for assignment to a command depot.
- E.—Requiring indoor hospital treatment:—
 - (i) in an officers' military or auxiliary convalescent hospital.
 - (ii) in a civilian hospital.

Is the officer permanently unfit for any further military service? Yes.
