My Lord;

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Lordship's despatch No. 770 of the 5th June on the subject of the proposed provision of an allowance of £1 per diem for the Governor's Deputy during the periods when the Governor himself is absent from Headquarters.

I concur in Sir Robert Coryndon's suggestion and estimate that in this Protectorate the allowance would be payable on approximately one hundred days in any one year.

As regards paragraph 3 of Your Lordship's despatch, I would venture to observe that £1 per diem seems scarcely adequate in view of the responsibility devolving upon the Governor's Deputy. I would suggest £3 per diem which I understand is the rate paid in the West Coast of Africa.
