My Lord,

Conveyed in Your Lordship's despatches, No. 828 of the 21st August 1919, and No. 1271 of the 25th November 1919, I have the honour to transmit two lists showing the personnel of the East Africa Local Forces (including Uganda), who were granted temporary commissions for the purposes of the local campaign.

2. The lists were compiled originally by the Officer-in-Charge, Records, and have been revised by the Staff Captain, East Africa Expeditionary Force, whose comments are noted in the margin of the enclosures.

3. Major Kenny has stated that shortage of clerical staff has prevented the re-typing of the lists. His office is about to be closed and in view of the delay in submission of these returns, I consider it advisable to forward them without further emendation.

3. While realising the difficulties under which the Lists have been prepared, I do not feel that they are, in their present form, suitable for transmission to the Army Council and, despite the further delay which will be involved, I regret that I must ask you to cause the Lists (which are returned herewith) to be revised and submitted to me in triplicate in a form more convenient for the purpose for which they are required.

4. In compiling the revised Lists special attention should be paid to the following points:-

(a) Against many of the entries on the lists now submitted appear remarks such as "civilian", "honorary rank only" and "local rank only". It will be for you to decide whether you recommend that temporary rank in the British Army should be given in these cases. If so, the entries ~~should~~ will no doubt, be excluded from the revised Lists.

(b) Marginal remarks such as "Imperial" "King's African Rifles" and "Commission Cancelled" appear against certain of the entries. ^{If w? seem} ~~and it will~~ be necessary to decide whether these entries should be shown at all on the revised Lists.

(c) From other communications which I have received from you regarding certain of the officers concerned it would appear that their names are not correctly spelt in the lists. ~~as above~~

In view of the time which has elapsed since this matter was first taken in hand I shall be glad if the revised lists can be prepared and submitted to me as soon as possible.
