I have the honour to inform you that the application for participation in the Ex-Soldier Settlement Scheme in this country, contained in your letter ~~dated~~ of June, 1920, unfortunately reached this country too late for favourable consideration by His Excellency the Governor. It had been definitely decided some time previously that no further applications could be entertained, and it is regretted that no exception can be made in your case.

2. The Secretary of State has been addressed by His Excellency the Governor and has been asked to apprise you of this decision. I would suggest that if you are desirous of settling in this country you should purchase land privately.
