I am directed by the Minister of Pensions to acquaint you for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies that awards of Alternative Pensions set out below have been made to the pensioner named above and notified to the Military Pensions Commissioner, Pretoria:-

- (a) 15/- a week plus 20% bonus from 9th June, 1919 to 2nd September, 1919.
- (b) 40/- a week from 3rd September, 1919 to 31st August, 1920.

These awards are in lieu of the previous unconfirmed awards made by the Military Pensions Board, Pretoria of 25/- a week from 27th May, 1919 to 31st August 1919 (Alternative Pension) and 30% disablement pension of 15/- a week from 1st September 1919 to 31st August 1920, but on receipt of further information which the Military Pensions Commissioner has been requested to furnish, it may be possible to award the Alternative Pension with effect from a date earlier than 9th June, 1919.

/Allowances

Allowances on the Alternative Pension scale payable during Approved treatment have been assessed at the rate of £2.15.0 a week to 2nd September, 1919 and £5.0.0 a week from 3rd September, 1919 (until re-assessment after March 31st 1923) and the Military Pensions Commissioner has been instructed that if the pensioner has been undergoing treatment in circumstances rendering him eligible for allowances since 9th June, 1919 or if he should do so in the future, issue of allowances on this scale subject to the usual deductions in the case of in-patient treatment and provided the degree of disablement is still assessed at more than 30% should be made in lieu of pension, and that information as to such periods should be furnished.

A further communication will be addressed to you on receipt of a further report from the Military Pensions Commissioner.
