Sir,

I have the honour to inform you in authority for the appointment of an Assistant Junior Staff Surveyor in the Cadastral Branch of the Survey Department with salary at the rate of £120 per annum plus £36 house allowance, in place of one of the 2nd grade Indian Surveyors whose salary is provided for in the current year's Estimates at Rs 100 by Rs 100 i.e. Rs. 300 per mensem.

2. It has not been possible to fill the latter post as it is becoming increasingly difficult to obtain suitable Indian Surveyors and it is therefore proposed in future to delete from the Estimates the appointment of one 2nd grade Indian Surveyor and substitute therefor an extra Assistant Junior Staff Surveyor.

3. Although a new appointment is created the actual Staff of Surveyors will be increased and the difference in the cost will only be the addition of a house allowance of £36 per annum to the salary attached to the new

With reference to the enclosures to my Confidential despatch No. 54 of the 5th ultimo, on the subject of the Currency of the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates, I have the honour to request that paragraph 14 of Mr Smallwood's minute of March 4th and paragraph 52 of my minute of March 18th be considered to be deleted.

2. The Mombasa Currency Commissioners, Mr. Major and Dr Radford, have informed us that neither of them intended to convey to Mr Smallwood the impression that they were favourably inclined to the proposals altering the Currency system of the Protectorates, as outlined in your Confidential despatch of the 19th January, as the papers relating to the matter not having been placed in their hands they had not had the opportunity of considering the proposals in their entirety, but merely that, if it were definitely decided to make the sovereign the standard coin and to mint an East African specie, they did not wish to oppose the adoption of the procedure which they gathered from Mr Smallwood was proposed concerning its exchange but they stipulated
