THE FUGITIVE CRIMINALS SURRENDER AMENDMENT ORDINANCE,1912.LEGAL REPORT.

The purpose of the Ordinance is to amend Section 12 of "The Fugitive Criminals Surrender Ordinance, 1908" by inserting words which were evidently omitted in error from the draft Ordinance enclosed in the Colonial Office despatch No. 75 of 1908, and on which the East Africa Ordinance was modelled, the effect of which omission is to render authenticated copies of depositions taken in a Foreign State inadmissible in evidence in proceeding under the Ordinance except the depositions evidence the fact of a conviction.

The Section now substituted for Section 12 in the original Ordinance is in the terms of Section 14 of the Extradition Act 1870.

This Ordinance is, in my opinion, necessary and may be assented to by His Excellency forthwith.
