I am of opinion best solution would be to offer to Grogan following alternatives; either that all timber declared by conservator of forests merchantable shall be taken to depot, measured and paid for at rate of one rupee 38 cents, whether passed through mill or not; or all timber passed through mill be paid for at rate 1 rupee 38 cents and all other timber declared merchantable, but which does not pass through mill, be measured by Forest Department and paid for at rate of 2 rupees. In the event of neither being acceptable must revert to original agreement of 2 rupees per tree.
