BRITISH LEGATION,

Sir:-

I have the honour to report that it has come to my knowledge that the Italian Government has established a Commercial Agent at Ginir in Dejaz Nado's country about eight days to the South of Adis Ababa and about the same distance from Harrar. This Agent is, I am told, an ex-naval officer. Signor Cora, the Italian Charge d'Affaires, in reply to my questions told me that the trade with the Benadir ports of Mogadishu and Brava is rapidly increasing.

The only practical trade route in the usually disturbed state of the country near the Webbe Shebeli, is from Ginir by the banks of the Ganale river to Dolo and u

Dolo is one of the places which I have suggested as suitable for a joint Anglo-Abyssinian custom house on the

model

model of the custom houses on the Sudan frontier. It would seem that geographically and in the absence of bounties or other special advantages, all trade which arrives at Dolo ought to go to Bardera the head of navigation on the Juba River.

Unfortunately this Legation knows nothing of the southern trade or of the Juba River. It would appear to me well with an eye to the future of Kismayu to study the trading methods of the Italians, their routes, facilities, etc. The East African frontier officers might be able to do so.

The Italians are commercially very active in this country. This officer at Ginir is the fifth agent they have in Abyssinia, besides the Legation at Adis Ababa. The other four are at Adowa, Dessie, Gondar and Harrar. I hear that the Dessie agent has managed to foster a trade by Assab on the Red Sea. Gondar and Adowa trade to Massowah.

2. Marconi stations being now established at

Massowah and Mogadishu, the Italian Government has desired
that an intermediate station at Adis Ababa should be

Signor Cora informed me yesterday that the concession has been granted in principle, but that the details remain to be settled. A wireless station here would render the land line unnecessary, and it would be discontinued. At present the wireless connexion between Massowah and Mogadishu works well by night only. It might be found that there are atmospheric difficulties in the way of a station here.

This information appears to me to be worth noting in view of a possible linking up of the Sudan and East Africa with this country by telegraph wireless or otherwise.
