Sir,

In the circumstances represented by Mr. Secretary Harcourt in Mr. Read's letter of the 24th instant (21885/1912) the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury assent to the proposed abolition of the Libby Agency and the appointment of Messrs. Mackinnon, Mackenzie and Company as Agents for the East Africa, Uganda and Nyasaland Protectorates, and of Messrs. Cowasjee, Dinesaw and Brothers as agents for Somaliland.

My Lords will be glad to be informed in due course of the charge made by the Indian Government for the work connected with the contingents of Indian troops for Somaliland, and their assent to the present proposals is given on the understanding that it will be much smaller than the payment (£400 per annum) claimed for undertaking the work in respect of the Uganda and Nyasaland contingents as well.

I am to request that a detailed report on the working and cost of the new arrangements may be furnished after three years' trial.
