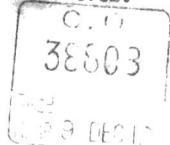

Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Read's letter of the 13th ultimo (34682/1912) on the subject of the staff of the Secretariat of the East Africa Protectorate.

Mr. Secretary Harcourt recommends that advantage be taken of the transfer to Sierra Leone of Mr. A. C. Hollis, Secretary for Native Affairs, to re-organise the Secretariat and proposes accordingly the following revised staff, which will effect a saving on present cost of £285 at the mean :-

1	Chief Secretary	£1,000 with £100 duty pay.
1	Assistant Chief Secretary	£600-25-700 with £60 duty pay.
2	Senior Assistant Secretaries	£400-25-500 with £40 duty pay.
2	Junior Assistant Secretaries	£250-15-400

My Lords are of opinion that the increment of the Senior Assistant Secretaries should be £20 only and not £25, as a £20 increment is more usual in the case of salaries of £400 to £500 a year. Subject to this alteration They concur in the revision recommended. They also agree in the circumstances represented that Mr. W. J. Monson, whom it is proposed to appoint Assistant Chief Secretary, should enter the scale

at

the Under Secretary of State,
Colonial Office.

at £675 as from 1st April last, and that the two senior Assistant Secretaries should be allowed to draw the new scale of pay as from the same date.
