D. Chamberlain's land should be taken up  
 at once if possible so the Committee of the  
 Deep Sea Pier must certainly send up some  
 values and this area is essential to  
 the proper development of the Terminal yard.

 and it is a great hindrance to development  
 and will give unwilling consent to the  
 tract at a dangerous point  
<sup>to serve the new deep pier</sup>  
 The Terminal yard must require racing & shooting  
 and baseball fields and these can't  
 be properly laid out without the acquisition of  
 D. Chamberlain's land.

In the recent loan of £500,000,  
£40,000 was included for improvement  
in terminal facilities at Kilindini.  
In our letter ~~explaining~~ <sup>applying</sup> the need for  
the loan, we explained this item by  
saying that the prospects of traffic had  
developed so considerably since we got the  
earlier loan of £100,000 for a deepwater pier  
that it would be necessary to equip the  
pier with facilities for handling traffic  
at considerably greater expense than was  
then contemplated, & that it would  
also be necessary to undertake immediate  
improvements in the existing wharf accommodation  
& fitting appliances for handling  
traffic to meet pressure pending the  
completion of the pier.

The acquisition of this piece of land  
can I think without any undue

stretching of conscience, be brought  
within the purpose putted at A above  
as certainly falls within the more £20  
general description given at B of the  
objects to which the £40,000 is to be  
devoted.

It is desirable that the Tel should fo  
in up her to present any leakage of  
the Govt's intentions.
