Mr. Wallis's suggestion appears first on 36615. We informed him that we were communicating with the Gov. E.A.P. This is the reply of E.A.P. The Governor agrees with Mr. Wallis's proposals and has inserted them in the 'summary of privileges' enclosed in the desp. No. 797 (30408). But he cannot recommend that rickshaws be allowed free transport.

① I have taken further action on 36615. Write to Gov. Uganda, with reference to our desp. 927th Nov. on 36615 and say that the Gov. E.A.P. agrees with the recommendation in para 4 of Mr. Wallis's desp. No. 797 with the exception of rickshaws. Also refer to our desp. No. 3899 and approve of the recommendations in para 4 of Mr. Wallis's desp. and also the proposal to include the Chief Justice in the list of officers entitled to a reward ration. And say that for the present the question of whether allowing free transport for rickshaws may be left open, since this appears to be
