Sir,

With reference to your despatch No. 174  
of the 8th of March I have the honour to inform  
you that I am of opinion that the amendments  
to the King's African Rifles Ordinance of this  
Protectorate, on the lines suggested by the Officer  
administering the Government of Nyasaland, are  
either necessary or desirable.

2. The concession referred to has been  
greatly appreciated, and as the Ordinance was  
only brought into force as recently as June 1912,  
I do not consider there is any need at this stage  
for amending legislation.

3. I presume the Ordinance was fully  
discussed by the Governors of the Protectorates  
affected thereby.
