

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 557 of the 11th of July respecting the admission of Veterinary Officers to the permanent and pensionable staff, and to inform you that the number of these appointments as stated in the second paragraph is correct.

2. The Veterinary Officers not yet admitted to the pensionable establishment have not served sufficiently long for me to estimate their capabilities to my satisfaction and I propose therefore to defer making any further recommendations until their qualifications have been more fully ascertained.

3. With regard to the third paragraph of your despatch provision exists in the current year's estimates for the engagement of ten Veterinary Officers. With the appointment of Mr. Wheeler and Mr. Henderson, who have recently arrived, nine Veterinary Officers are already on the staff of the Department and in the event of Mr. Hall accepting an appointment the establishment will be complete.
