THE CLASS OF CASES ARISING UNDER THE MERCHANT
SHIPPING ACT WHICH CAN BE AND ARE IN
PRACTICE DEALT WITH IN ALL PARTS
AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

The class of cases arising under the Merchant Shipping Act which can be dealt with in this Protectorate are presumably offences under Section 211 (refusal to permit a seaman or apprentice to make a complaint) under Sections 220-228 (provisions as to discipline) and under Section 237 (offences in connection with passenger steamers) and certain offences in connection with Merchant Ships.

2. I am informed that in practice the High Court has never been called on to exercise any jurisdiction under the Merchant Shipping Act such as would be exercised by a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace in a British possession.
