I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No:519 of the 2nd ultimo respecting the imposition of a communal fine in connection with certain cases of theft of cattle which have recently occurred from the Veterinary Quarantine Camp at Fort Ternan and to report that the procedure prescribed in Section 6 of the Collective Punishment Ordinance 1909 was duly observed. The inquiry was held by the District Commissioner, Kericho, a Magistrate of the Second Class, and the evidence taken and his findings were submitted to the Attorney General for opinion before the infliction of the fine was sanctioned.
