Your telegram of July 17th Proposed expenditure made up of special plague duty allowances to staff £340; salaries Sanitary Inspector and clerical staff, £590; emergency menial staff to clean up Town, £300; passage of medical officers and other staff, £700; local travelling and transport, £320; plant disinfectants disinfectors instruments serum vaccine etc., £1,500; camp equipment and hospital tents, £2,000; contingencies £500; Total £5,800. Am in communication with Simpson with regard to qualifications of medical officers and will telegraph later. Authority to proceed with local expenditure urgently required, especially menial staff and camp equipment. Sanitary equipment available locally.
