If in service of the Protectorate is the service of the Crown & by ord. he will have had 5 years service. I must put his case to Home Office & if they concur that he is eligible ask them to supply with the necessary forms for his naturalization under the Act. I presume that the character is satisfactory.

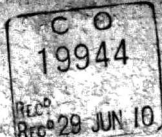
