

Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the second paragraph of your confidential despatch of July 29th and to inform you that the "secret instructions" handed over by Mr Hope to Captain Barrett consisted of a memorandum, copy attached, drawn up by Sir Percy Girouard after discussing the position on the frontier with his civil and military advisers in February, 1912.

2. The instructions were enclosed in a sealed envelope and were to be available for the civil or, in his temporary absence from the station, the military officer in charge of Moyale. This envelope was only to be opened in the event of emergency.

AUXING GOVERNOR,

Secret Instructions under which the officer  
in charge is to act in the event of certain  
circumstances arising at Moyale.

In the event of a state of anarchy  
and general rebellion arising in Abyssinia it  
will be for the officer in charge M. F.M.D. to  
consider the desirability of the temporary  
abandonment of Moyale if threatened by any  
serious opposition. In such an event immovable  
stores should be destroyed and the forces at  
Moyale and any other southern point where  
Sereniti retires or Marsabit. The British  
Minister to be informed.
